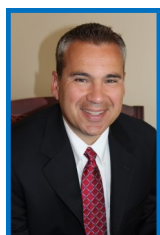

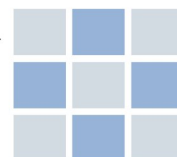

DENTAL HEALTH FOR STUDENTS

Did you know that Hometown Health also offers a Dental Hygiene program in Schenectady City Schools?! This is a great opportunity to have your child seen by a Hometown Health Registered Dental Hygienist for routine teeth screening, cleaning, fluoride treatment or teeth sealants during the school day. Look for a dental permission form, to be sent home with your child, throughout the school year or ask your Hometown Health Provider or Dentist for more information. By returning your child's permission form their name will go into a drawing to win some great prizes. The hygienists also give healthy snack parties in the classrooms if each child returns their dental form.



WINTER WEATHER HEALTH & SAFETY TIPS

- Stay indoors during storms
- Wear a hat, hood or scarf
- Wear layers of clothing
- Keep fingertips, ears, and nose covered outside
- Keep clothing dry
- Use a hair dryer or small heater to thaw frozen pipes, never an open flame
- Stretch before you go outside to remove snow

Does your child attend Schenectady High, Mont Pleasant Middle School, or Hamilton Elementary?

If yes, they can be enrolled in our School Based Health Center Program!

Students who are enrolled in the **SBHC** program can be seen for medical care and treatment at school, during school hours, without the need for a parent or guardian to be with them, and then return to class after their visit.

Medical services include: routine and preventive care, administration of medication, routine physicals, immunizations, screening tests, counseling and health education.

Ask for an enrollment form from any Hometown Health Centers Provider or Associate, at any of the participating schools, or online at hometownhealthcenters.org



Hometown Health will bill all insurances.

There is no copay for a student to be seen at the School Based Health Center.
